Students enrolled in these courses spend one hour a week in the English Computer Lab focusing on a variety of activities including creating and revising work, using various software programs to strengthen writing skills, doing research on the Internet, etc. Time spent in the computer lab will help students develop the skills they need to succeed in college and the workplace.

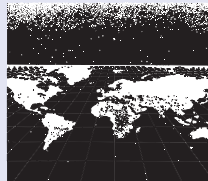
